Dalton Hartle 3-4-5 All Around Champion

Tell me a little bit about yourself. (age, school, parents etc) I'm 11 years old. I attend Argos Community Schools. I'm in the sixth grade. I love Rodeo! I have wanted to be a stock contractor since I was little. I have been roping and riding all my life. My parents are Stacy and Lisa Hartle of Culver, Indiana. I have one brother Kolton Paul Hartle.

What events do you compete in? Which event is your favorite and why? I compete in tie down calf roping, breakaway roping, goat tie, team roping, and ribbon roping. My favorite event is Calf roping. When I was in the younger divisions I watched the older boys and thought it would be fun. I could not wait until I was big enough to do it myself.

What else do you like to do outside of IJRA? I like to play basketball, fish and show cattle at the county fair. I also like to trail ride and barrel race.

Do you have any role models or advice someone has given you that you would like to tell us about? Mike and Sherrylynn Johnson have been a big influence. I meet them two years ago for my 10th birthday present. They have told me to keep working hard and never give up! My Biggest role model is my dad. He

has helped me the most to learn horsemanship, riding and roping skills. He says "Do your Best Every Time!"

Other than winning the All-Around, what was your favorite or most memorable moment of your 2010-2011 IJRA season? When I won my first All-around metal and nobody told me until Jack announced it at the Rodeo. My most memorable moment was after I lost my grandpa in December 2010, I told my parents that I was

Do you have any advise for other kids who would like to compete in rodeo or who would like to win an All-Around saddle? I want to tell all kids to keep working hard because it does pay off. Working hard everyday and listening to your parents will make you a winner.

What are your plans/goals for the 2011-2012 season? My goals for the 2011-2012 season are to have a good rookie year and make it to the Jr. National Finals in Gallup, New Mexico. If I cannot place in all my events, I'm working the hardest to make it with my ribbon roping partner Abbie White and my Team roping partner Noah Duby. I don't want to let my partners down. Keep working Hard it pays off in the end!

Grace Hasler 3-4-5 All Around Champion

Tell me a little bit about yourself. (age, school, parents etc) I am 12 years old and am in 6th grade at St. Peter's Lutheran School in Columbus, Indiana. My parents are Michael and Dena Hasler and I have a younger sister, Mel, who also competes in IJRA.

What events do you compete in? Which event is your favorite and why? I compete in Barrels, Poles, Goat Tie and Breakaway Roping. My favorite event is barrels because I love the speed events, and it is my best event with my mare, Bugsy.

What else do you like to do outside of IJRA? I also run the Southern Indiana Jr. Rodeo Association. I show my pleasure horse, Elmo, in hunter under saddle, western pleasure and showmanship. I am involved in the 4-H Horse & Pony

Club and compete on the horse judging team. I also play basketball on my school team and on an AAU team.

Do you have any role models or advice someone has given you that you would like to tell us about? My grandpa, Dick Wetzel, is a horse trader and an amazing horseman. He always reminds me that being a good horseman is about having good hands, and that the more horses you climb up on, the better rider you will become.

Tina Litkenhus, from Lawrenceburg, KY, is a great role model. She has taught me alot about barrels, poles and goats. Tina always encourages me to compete against myself, always trying to improve my "personal best" time. She also says, "Practice, practice, practice!"

Other than winning the All-Around, what was your favorite or most memorable moment of your 2010-2011 IJRA season? My most memorable moment was catching my breakaway calf at the 2011 State Finals.

Tell us about your horses. I am so blessed to have 2 great horses to compete on. My rope/goat horse, Hustler, is 23 years old and does everything I ask him to do. I have been riding Hustler for 5 years now, and he still trots away from me in the pasture. My barrel/pole mare, Bugsy, is 21 years old, and gives 110% every time we run. They have both taught me so much and, without them, I would not have had the success I had this past year!

Do you have any advise for other kids who would like to compete in rodeo or who would like to win an All-Around saddle? Try not to pay too much attention to points. Compete against yourself and try to improve your "personal best" with every run. Also, we need to take the time to appreciate our horses and to thank our parents for the time and effort they put into getting us to the rodeos.

What are your plans/goals for the 2011-2012 season? My goal is to qualify for the 2012 Jr. High National Finals Rodeo in Gallup, New Mexico.
